

## Making the Most of Your Machine Applique - Supply List

Sewing Machine in good working order

Basic sewing supplies

Open toed appliqué foot

Darning or free-motion foot

Bobbins

Thread in colors to match your fabrics, also bring gray or black

Pencil

Scissors for cutting paper and fabric

Rotary cutter, mat, and ruler

1 yard Heat 'n Bond Lite fusible web

Applique Pressing Sheet

1 yard of tear-away stabilizer or 4-5 sheets of light-weight computer paper

Clear vinyl, approximately 15"x 15"

Fine line Sharpie marker

Fabric sandwich, approximately 18"x 22" of two light colored fabrics with light weight batting inside for a little free-motion experience.

We will be making a machine appliquéd block of a teapot, tablecloth, and rose in a vase.

Instructor will provide the appliqué design and the vase fabric (organza).

For fabrics you will need:

Background fabric – Fat Quarter

Teapot Trim – Scrap

Tablecloth – 10" x 12"

Flower stem and leaves – 3" x 6"

Water, light blue – 3" x 3"

Teapot – 8" x 10"

Teacup and Saucer – 5" x 5"

Rose – 3" x 3"

Tea inside cup – 2" x 4" or scrap
